

# WINNING ROULETTE STRATEGY

## (Part II)



In the previous issue, we discussed a common roulette strategy and a common mistake – ie. Don't ever play roulette like most people do. Most people when they play roulette will immediately start placing chips all over the table. This is a sure-lose strategy in the long run.

What we should be aiming for is maximizing the chance of allowing ourselves to win. **Try not to bet by staking more than is necessary to win the same amount or even worse, lose more than you win.**

Remember this rule when playing roulette. The more you spread the bet out all over the table, the more it seems like you are winning. But when you do win, more often than not, your winnings are barely enough to cover your stakes. But your loss will be big when none of your chips win.

In this issue, we discussed another mistake or myth to avoid in trying to beat the Roulette game.

### MISTAKE TO AVOID IN TRYING TO BEAT THE ROULETTE



Roulette game is a game of chance and no player or gadget can predict where the ball will land.

Therefore, no strategy is likely increase your odds in winning, it just can increase your winning chances by giving you advice on how to bet in order to win more and lose less.

If you have ever visited a casino (or watched other people play online roulette) then no doubt you have seen people keeping notes of what numbers have come up in previous games. This is very common and encouraged by casinos often with a free supply of pre-printed cards and pens to help

you with the process. At casinos, a large list of all the previous numbers are usually displayed for you to see the sequence they came out.



The theory is that because there is an equal chance of each number dropping in. Also, because the law of chance dictates that numbers will always average out in the long run, then surely if a number has not dropped in for a high number of spins, it must be due any time now.

So you keep betting on that number because it must - by the law of averages - be a winner very soon.

Nice theory, you can completely forget about it. If a particular roulette number has not dropped in for 10,000 spins, this does not mean that it is any more likely to be the next winner. Of course, the odds of that roulette number not being a winner for 10,000 spins are huge. Apparently, it may seem to be true. But the fact is that there is exactly a 36-1 chance of a particular number landing for the next spin. In other words, every number has an equal chance to come in as the winner.

So here's another tip for to remember: What has happened in the past has no influence on what will happen in the future. The next time you see someone betting on a certain number, or a colour etc., because that particular bet has not won for a while, remember this. It may or may not win, if it feels like a good idea and you're prepared to take the risk then go for it by all means. But whether it wins or loses is a matter of luck and not the fact that it was due to win.
